Dr. Hamza Alduraidi

Associate Professor in Community Health Nursing Department at the School of Nursing at the University of Jordan, and a member of the Accreditation Committee of the Jordanian Nursing Council (JNC).

Dr. Alduraidi obtained his Bachelor's degree in Nursing from the University of Jordan in 2008, and his Master's degree in Public Health from the School of Medicine at the University of Jordan in 2010, then he obtained a second Master's degree in Advanced Practice of Public Health Nursing from the University of California - San Francisco (UCSF) in 2013, then a PhD in Nursing from the same university in 2016, where his doctoral thesis addressed the health of Palestinian refugees inside and outside the camps in Jordan.

Dr. Alduraidi has published over 30 research papers in a number of prestigious journals, a large number of which dealt with the physical, psychological and social aspects of health of in Palestinian and Syrian refugees in Jordan, in addition to a number of other public health topics, such as non-communicable diseases, the COVID-19 epidemic and child mortality. During his career at the University of Jordan, Dr. Alduraidi held a number of administrative tasks, including the Dean for Student Affairs in Aqaba Medical Sciences University, Nursing Vice Dean, Assistant Dean for Quality Affairs, Director of the Accreditation and Ranking Department at the Accreditation and Quality Assurance Center at the University of Jordan, and director of Development and Capacity Building Department at the Open Educational Resources Center at the University of Jordan, in addition to membership of a number of committees at the school, university and national levels.
